<i>Bequest</i> – percentage of estate	A bequest in your will, a legal document specifying how your property will be distributed after your death. <i>Bequest</i> – specific gift amount and/or asset	A bequest in your will, a legal document specifying how your property will be distributed after your death. Benefits ASNF, reduces your estate’s tax liability.	“I hereby give, devise, and bequeath \$ _____ amount _____ and/or _____ asset _____ to the American Society for Nutrition, a §501(c)(3) organization located in Rockville, MD, to provide support for its mission and general purposes.”
<i>Bequest</i> – residuary estate	A bequest in your will, a legal document specifying how your property will be distributed after your death. Benefits ASNF, reduces your estate’s tax liability.	“I hereby give, devise, and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, both real and personal, wherever located – to the American Society for Nutrition, a §501(c)(3) organization located in Rockville, MD, to provide support for its mission and general purposes.”
<i>Beneficiary</i> – percentage or full beneficiary of bank account, brokerage account or life insurance policy	A set-aside in your account can result in tax savings for your heirs, and ASNF will receive part or all of your account after your death.	Complete a Change of Beneficiary form to name ASNF as a beneficiary of part or all of your bank account, brokerage account or life insurance policy.
<i>Gift</i> – life insurance policy	You donate a policy, making ASN the irrevocable owner and beneficiary of a policy. You take a deduction, deduct any future premium payments, make an extraordinary gift and avoid estate tax.	Contact ASNF; insurance policy should be a paid-up policy or a policy with internal cash value on which future payments are owed. ASNF may keep the policy in force, or may sell or surrender the policy at any time to invest with its endowed accounts.
<i>Beneficiary</i> – percentage or full beneficiary of traditional IRA, Roth IRA, 403(b) or other retirement plan	Distributions at death to a charity are tax-free, but are subject to income tax and possibly estate tax when left to loved ones.	Complete a Change of Beneficiary form to name ASNF as a beneficiary of part or all of your retirement account. Note that you can continue to take withdrawals from your plan during your life, and that you may be required to obtain spousal consent for the ASNF designation.
<i>Other</i> – endowment, designated fund	You can create a named fund with an endowment to support programs, awards, etc. in perpetuity (for example, the E.L.R. Stokstad Fund, endowed by the Stokstad family in honor of their father). ASNF has established a scholarships program, and can also facilitate a major bequest/gift in support of a specific program (for example, Symposium at an ASN meeting).	Contact the ASNF staff to discuss additional options. We can also connect you with the ASN financial advisor to address investment-related questions (gifts of securities, stocks, etc.).
