The position is supported by a long-term food research program funded from the Carolina Population Center. The faculty appointment will be in the Department of Nutrition in the Nutrition Epidemiology Division. The position will conduct policy research related to the evaluation of the ways food industry and an array of other policies and regulatory changes affect US food purchasing patterns and dietary intake. The person will work with a team of economists and nutritionists on longitudinal and cross-sectional research related to understand what changes affect caloric intake of the US population. This scholar will integrate an array of other research with this team's research. The person will work for a program led by Barry Popkin.
