

FACULTY POSITION IN NUTRITION

The Department of Human Nutrition at Kansas State University invites applicants for an Assistant Professor tenure-track faculty appointment to begin Fall 2010. The position is a nine-month appointment that includes research, teaching, and service responsibilities. Preferred area of expertise is listed below:

Public Health Nutrition. The successful candidate's research will involve human nutrition with a public health/community nutrition emphasis. Demonstrated competence in at least one of the following is expected: nutrition needs and health outcomes, population-based or community-based studies, nutritional epidemiology or diet assessment methodologies. Experience in public health/community nutrition or an MPH degree in public health nutrition is preferred.

Required qualifications include an earned doctorate in nutrition or related field, capacity to do research and publish in peer-reviewed journals, enthusiasm for and competence in teaching, and the ability to obtain external funding. Kansas State University offers a competitive compensation package and an attractive benefits package.

The Department of Human Nutrition offers programs leading to the BS, MS, and PhD degrees in human nutrition and participates in the interdisciplinary Masters of Public Health (MPH) program. Curricula within Human Nutrition include Nutritional Sciences, Nutrition and Exercise, Public Health Nutrition, Sensory Analysis, and Athletic Training. The Department cooperates with other units on campus including the Departments of Kinesiology; Hospitality, Management and Dietetics; Animal Science and Industry; Anatomy and Physiology; Grain Science; Food Science Institute; the Community Health Institute; Galicia Center on Aging; and the Terry C. Johnson Cancer Research Center.

Manhattan is located in the scenic Flint Hills of Kansas, 125 miles west of Kansas City. It is home to Kansas State University, a comprehensive, research, land-grant institution.
